**Public Information Subcommittee activities** 

Aug 2025

#### Activities:

- 1. I was going to put up flyers on the Pearl St. Mall, but broke my finger, so that'll have to wait.
- 2. I updated the meeting lists to include the change in the women's meeting from 6 to 7pm on Mondays as well as corrected the password for the Sunday Alano club meeting.
- 3. I restocked the Lit rack at the works program. This seems to be the lit rack that consistently gets the most use.
- 4. I restocked the IPs and updated the meeting lists in the Boulder County Jail lobby.
- 5. I gave the Recovery Café a stack of updated meeting lists to put in the lit rack. They had something going on in the room where the lit rack was, so I was unable to check on the inventory of IPs, I will circle back to them next



chance I get.

- 6. I restocked the IPs at the Boulder County Public Defender's office and Community Connections Project at 1241 Kimbark St. in Longmont and updated their stock of meeting lists.
- 7. I went to CU to restock their lit rack at the Recovery Club in the UMC. They basically had no use of any of the IPs or meeting lists, but I changed out the new for the old.
- 8. While I was at CU, I put flyers up at the UMC bulletin boards. They are removed every ten days, so I asked a gentleman at the recovery club if he would be so kind as to put new ones up every two weeks. He agreed to do so, so I gave him around 25-30 of out 8x11 flyers. If you are a CU student, can you help me determine if this is getting done? If not, I might need announcements done to find someone else who is reliable to do it for us.

  9. I went to the methadone clinic to restock and update their lit rack. Much to my chagrin, they were closed but I could see that it was no longer in their lobby. I called the following day and got the manager's number. My call to her voicemail was not returned, several times. I finally talked to her.

  Apparently, they had an inspection, and it was determined that the rack was somehow in the way. She ordered a table specifically for our rack.

  When I went to restock it, it was pretty depleted. I need to return when I get more IPs on Mental Health in Recovery.
- 10. I printed out a CRCNA flyer that TJ gave me and had copies made. It is an invitation to H&I facilities to come to CRCNA for free. I will send them to treatment facilities so they know to bring their residents to CRCNA. We also need GSRs to take a couple back to their groups and announce free admission to treatment facilities and encourage them to take a flyer back to their facility to facilitate organizing and scheduling to get to CRCNA.

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- 11. I printed over 400 meeting lists. This includes lists for H&I, the PI literature racks and lists for all the meetings. The cost was \$166.05. I paid for it and need to be reimbursed.
- 12. I recommend all meetings replace their old meeting lists with these new ones so fewer people get incorrect information about the available meetings in our area.
- 13. I had another 200 printed for meetings in general. If you know of a meeting that you regularly attend who does not have a GSR present here today, please grab some for that meeting and bring them to the meeting when you go.
- 14. I have ordered \$100 in IPs this month.
- 15. I picked up the mail. It was only a few months of bank statements.

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







