Activities:

1. First things first, I have taken a job that has me working 3 - 12-hour shifts, including Sundays. The bad news is that for the foreseeable future, until December or January, I will be absent from AREA. The good news is the three-day workweek will reopen my ability to fulfill my PI duties like back in the early days. Thankfully, I have a wife who is as committed to being of



service to AREA as I am and can report for me in my absence and can bring the meeting lists to AREA for distribution to all the meetings.

- 2. I put up flyers on the Pearl St. Mall kiosks. Many of the flyers from the previous visit to the mall were still visible despite exposure to the elements, so more were added in the same manner that gave them longevity.
- 3. I paid the KGNU quarterly bill, with our NAASC debit card, for the generous number of spots they air for us. We pay \$250 for something like 66 spots, or \$4 each that reach 20,000 listeners!
- 4. I checked the Lit rack at the works program. This seems to be the lit rack that consistently gets the most use but was fine for the time being.
- 5. I revisited the Recovery Café to check the stock of the lit rack. It is barely being used.
- 6. I went out to Broomfield to the Refuge Café. I gave them updated meeting lists, but noticed little usage of the Ips that are there.
- 7. This got me thinking that we, as an AREA, can probably put our heads together and think of locations for these lit racks of Ips that can better serve the addict that still suffers. Please, help me think of some unorthodox locations that can be more effective is spreading our message. If you get an idea, let me know and I'll look into its viability.
- 8. I went to the methadone clinic and gave them the Mental Health in Recovery Ips that I ran out of when I originally restocked it last month. They still don't have the table they ordered to give the rack its own platform, but they assure me it's coming.
- 9. I printed over 225 meeting lists. The cost was only \$56.25. I paid for it and need to be reimbursed.
- 10. I have ordered \$100 in IPs this month.
- 11. I did not pick up the mail. I will do so either next month or the one following.







