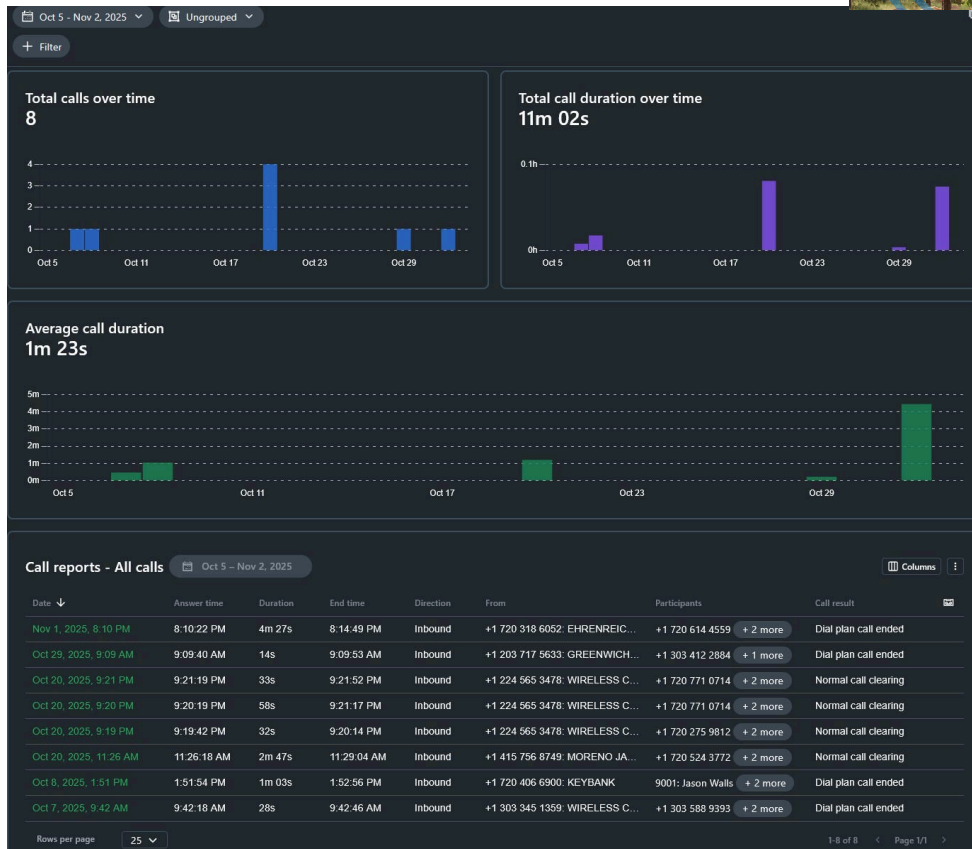

Proposal: That Boulder Area Service Committee support and help coordinate a Sexual Safety and Boundaries Workshop for members, facilitated by 2 trainers offered by the Region. The workshop will focus on how groups & trusted servants can respond appropriately when a member reports feeling unsafe or uncomfortable due to boundary violations or inappropriate sexual behavior, while maintaining our principles of animosity, unity & loving service; it should also train on recognizing warning signs & mitigating potentially negative dynamics

Intent: To equip members with awareness, skills & spiritual tools to mitigate & address unsafe dynamics & boundary violations before they escalate. To help ensure every member feels safe & respected & valued at meetings. To establish a harmonized & shared minimum standard of sexual safety & accountability across all Boulder-area groups, harmonizing how we approach & address these concerns in alignment with our traditions. First workshop would be a pilot effort; if members & participants find value we could explore offering bi-annual training in the trainer sessions for members who wish to bring these skills & knowledge back to their home groups.
